1. INTRODUCTION

For the purpose of this document, public participation is the interaction and engagement between the public and those undertaking the Environmental Authorisation (EA) process. The Public Participation Process (PPP) is a two way communication process which helps the public understand the processes and mechanisms through which environmental issues and needs are investigated and resolved by the responsible agency. The process also keeps all Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) informed of the status and decision made for a project.

The PPP takes into consideration all comments and concerns raised by the public. This includes the resource which should be used, as well as the alternative developments being considered.

The Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA, now the Department of Environment, Forestry and Fisheries- DEFF) released the Integrated Environmental Management Guidelines Series (Guideline 7) in 2012. This Guideline provides guidance on the procedure and provisions of the PPP in terms of the National Environmental Management Act (No. 107 of 1998) (NEMA) and its Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations, 2014 (as amended 7 April 2017) (the “EIA Regulations”)¹, as well as other regulations. According to the DEA, “public participation is one of the most important aspects of the EA process” and this is “because people have a right to be informed about potential decisions that may affect them and to be afforded an opportunity to influence those decisions”.

1.1 COVID-19

On 5 June 2020, the Minister of DEFF issued Directions² regarding measures to address, prevent and combat the spread of COVID-19 relating to National Environmental Management Permits and Licences.

The purpose of these Directions is to limit the threat posed by the COVID-19 Pandemic, as well as to alleviate, contain and minimise the effects of the National State of Disaster. This is particularly relevant to environmental licencing, as well as the PPP, processes.

In accordance with Annexure 3 of the Directions, a Public Participation Plan is required prior to submission of the Application for EA. The Public Participation Plan must be agreed to, and approved by, the Competent Authority (CA) prior to the application being submitted.

The purpose of this document is to present the Public Participation Plan for the Project to the CA, i.e. DEFF.

1.2 Application History

Moyeng Energy (Pty) Ltd (hereafter referred to as Moyeng Energy or the Project Proponent) has identified the potential to develop various wind energy facility projects to add capacity to the national electricity grid. Extensive pre-feasibility analyses and site identification processes was undertaken by Moyeng Energy and their wind engineers Windlab in identifying potentially suitable sites for wind energy development. A site was identified for the establishment of the facility which is located 3km west of Darling within the Western Cape Province. This proposed development is referred to as the Rheboksfontein Wind Energy Facility.

An Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process was conducted by Savannah Environmental during 2010 and 2011, with an Environmental Authorisation (EA) application submitted to the Department of Environment, Forestry and Fisheries (DEFF)¹, and subsequently authorised on 2 February 2012 (DEFF Reference: **12/12/20/1582**) in terms of regulation 37 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2006. The existing EA, and relevant EA amendments is attached as Appendix A to this report.

Six amendments to the EA were granted by the DEFF as follows:

- An amendment to the conditions of the EA was issued to Moyeng Energy in response to appeals submitted by stakeholders;
- An amendment in respect of a change of the name of the holder of the EA and an amendment of text in the project description was granted on 27 June 2014;
- An amendment in respect of a two year extension of validity of the EIA was granted on 30 January 2015;
- An amendment to the project description was granted on 28 May 2015;
- An amendment in respect of a two year extension of validity of the EIA was granted on 22 November 2016; and
- An amendment in respect of a change of the name of the holder of the EA and a two year extension of validity of the EIA was granted on 5 March 2019. The EA is currently valid until 2 February 2021.

It must be noted that the power line between the Rheboksfontein Wind Energy Facility and the Aurora Substation (or potentially Dassenberg Substation), is authorised separately to this EA. The EA for the construction of a 132kV power line between the authorised Rheboksfontein Wind Energy Facility and the Aurora Substation (DEA Ref No.: 14/12/16/3/3/1/1533) was granted on 8 July 2016. Therefore the potential impact of the power line and of the substation is not considered in this amendment application.

1.3 Proposed Amendment

Moyeng Energy now wishes to maximise the generating capacity in order to add new capacity to the national electricity grid in line with the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy's (DMRE) Renewable Energy Independent Power Producer Procurement Programme (REIPP Procurement Programme). A maximum capacity of 140MW is permitted in the REIPP Procurement Programme and this will allow for economies of scale and the lowest possible energy pricing.

As such, Moyeng Energy has since identified changes which will increased the capacity output based on wind turbine technology evolution whilst not increasing the project area of influence.

The proposed amendments to the Project description are as follows:

- Increased turbine rotor diameter: from 126m to up to 170m;

- Increased hub height: from 120m to 130m;
- Increased maximum output capacity: from 129MW to 140MW;
- Removal of turbine locations 32 and 33;
- Increased temporary laydown area: from 40x40m to 50x65m;
- Removal of the restriction of a steel tower; and
- Increased turbine footprint: from 15x15m to 25x25m.

In addition to these changes, Moyeng Energy wishes to extend the validity of the EA, which is due to expire in February 2021. Moyeng Energy wishes to extend the validity a further 5 years, as there is uncertainty related to the commencement of Round 5 of the REIPP Procurement Programme and resultant uncertainty of start of construction, should the project be awarded.

2.2 Part 2 Amendment Process

A part 2 Amendment Process is carried out in terms of Regulation 31 and 32 of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) regulations (GN No. 982 of 2014) of the National Environmental Management Act (No. 107 of 1998) (NEMA), as amended GN No. 326 of 2017 and in GN No. of 706 of 2018.

Part 2: Amendments where a change in scope occurs

31. Amendments to be applied for in terms of Part 2

An environmental authorisation may be amended by following the process prescribed in this Part if the amendment will result in a change to the scope of a valid environmental authorisation where such change will result in an increased level or change in the nature of impact where such level or change in nature of impact was not—

- (a) assessed and included in the initial application for environmental authorisation; or*
- (b) taken into consideration in the initial environmental authorisation;*

and the change does not, on its own, constitute a listed or specified activity.

32. Process and consideration of application for amendment

(1) The applicant must within 90 days of receipt by the competent authority of the application made in terms of regulation 31, submit to the competent authority—

- (a) a report, reflecting—*
 - (i) an assessment of all impacts related to the proposed change;*
 - (ii) advantages and disadvantages associated with the proposed change; and*
 - (iii) measures to ensure avoidance, management and mitigation of impacts associated with such proposed change; and*
 - (iv) any changes to the EMPr;*

which report—

- (aa) had been subjected to a public participation process, which had been agreed to by the competent authority, and which was appropriate to bring the proposed change to the attention of potential and registered interested and affected parties, including organs of state, which have jurisdiction in respect of any aspect of the relevant activity, and the competent authority, and*
- (bb) reflects the incorporation of comments received, including any comments of the competent authority; or*
- (b) a notification in writing that the report will be submitted within 140 days of receipt of the application by the competent authority, as significant changes have been made or significant new information has been added to the report, which changes or information was not contained in the report consulted on during the initial public participation process contemplated in subregulation (1)(a) and that the revised report will be subjected to another public participation process of at least 30 days.*

(2) In the event where subregulation (1)(b) applies, the report, which reflects the incorporation of comments received, including any comments of the competent authority, must be submitted to the competent authority within 140 days of receipt of the application by the competent authority.

The Draft Amendment Report report is submitted for public review, during which time ERM present the key findings to all Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs).

All comments made by I&APs are captured in a Comments and Response Report and in this report responses to all issues and concerns raised during the public review period are provided.

All recommendations cited in the final Report must be detailed in an Environmental Management Programme Report (EMPr), which defines the mitigation/ enhancement actions to be implemented. EMPr is recognised as important tool for the sound environmental management of projects.

2.3 Register of I&AP's

A preliminary database has been compiled of authorities (local and provincial), Non-Governmental Organisations, neighbouring landowners and other key stakeholders. This database of registered I&APs will be maintained and updated during the ongoing EIA process.

2.4 Notification of I&AP's in Terms of Regulation 41 of the EIA Regulations, 2014 (as amended 1 April 2017)

2.4.1 Site Notices

According to the EIA Regulations, a notice board must be fixed at a place conspicuous to, and accessible by, the public; (i.e. at the boundary, on the fence or along the corridor of the site).

Site notices will be erected and will be the required size in accordance with the EIA Regulations, as well as laminated and mounted to steel poles (where possible). This will ensure that the site notices are available for the full duration of the PPP. Please see Appendix C for the Site Notice template.

Site Notices will be placed at the following locations:

- Darling Public Library; and
- Swartland Municipal Office, 46 Main Road, Yzerfontein

2.4.2 Newspaper Adverts

The Project and the opportunity to comment will be advertised in the local paper and regional paper. The project will be advertised in Die Burger (English) and Die Weslander (Afrikaans) on 10 December 2020.

The advertisements will outline the Project, as well as the process which will be followed in terms of the EA process. The advertisements will also include contact details of the EAP, as well as how to register as an I&AP.

2.5 The Draft Amendment Report and EMPr Availability

The Draft Report and EMPr will be made available to I&APs for a 30-day period. Registered and identified I&APs will be notified of the release of the Draft Report and where the report can be reviewed.

If any of the I&APs have difficulty accessing the Draft Amendment Report and EMPr, it will be possible for them to request and collect a hardcopy from a location to be determined at that stage (pending national or local restrictions related to Covid-19). Comments received on the Draft Report and EMPr will be assimilated and the EIA Project team will provide appropriate responses to all comments. A CRR will be appended to the Final Amendment Report, which will be submitted to DEFF for decision-making.

In addition, all registered I&APs will be notified when an Environmental Authorisation has been issued by DEFF.

2.6 Notification of the Decision Made by the DEFF

Once the DEFF has made a decision on the Draft Amendment Report and EMP, an email will be sent to each I&AP notifying them of the decision, as well as the link to the EA issued by DEFF. Those I&APs who do not have access to email will be notified via alternate means (post, fax, sms or similar) If the I&AP cannot access the EA online, they must contact the EAP who will use one of the following methods to ensure the I&AP receives the document:

MAP OF RELATIVE AGRICULTURE THEME SENSITIVITY



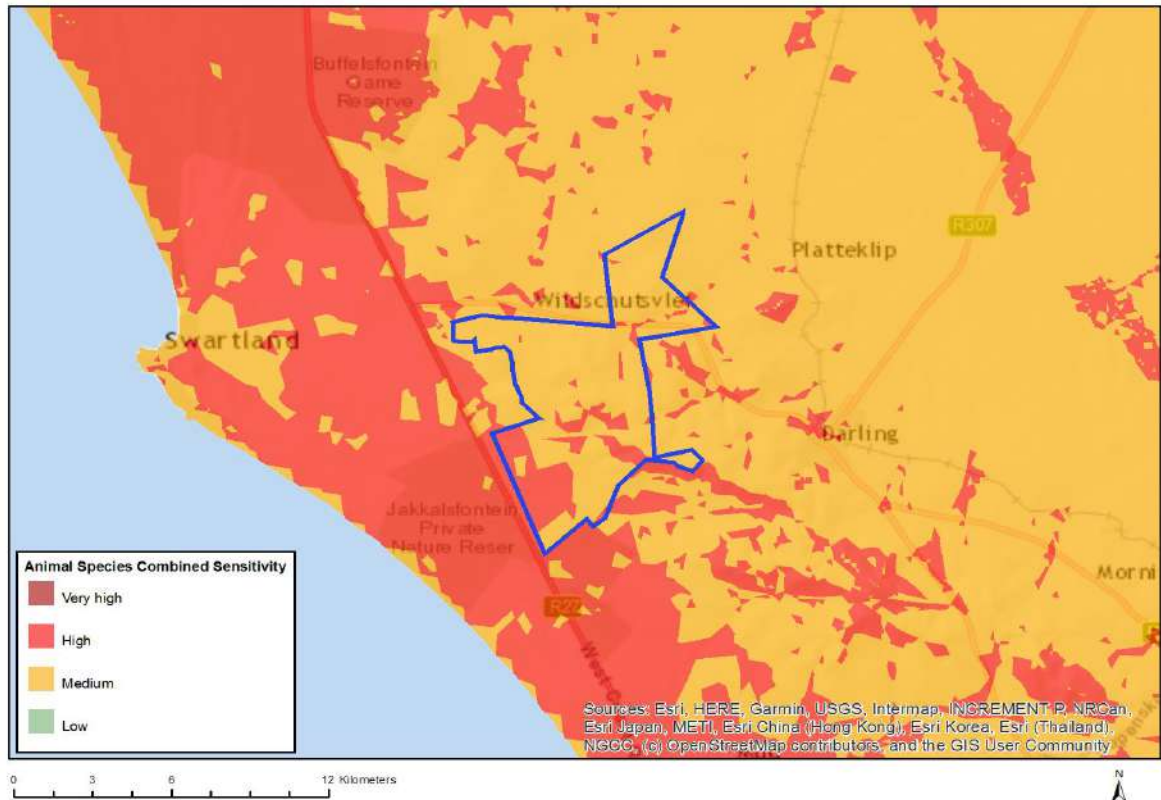

MAP OF RELATIVE ANIMAL SPECIES THEME SENSITIVITY

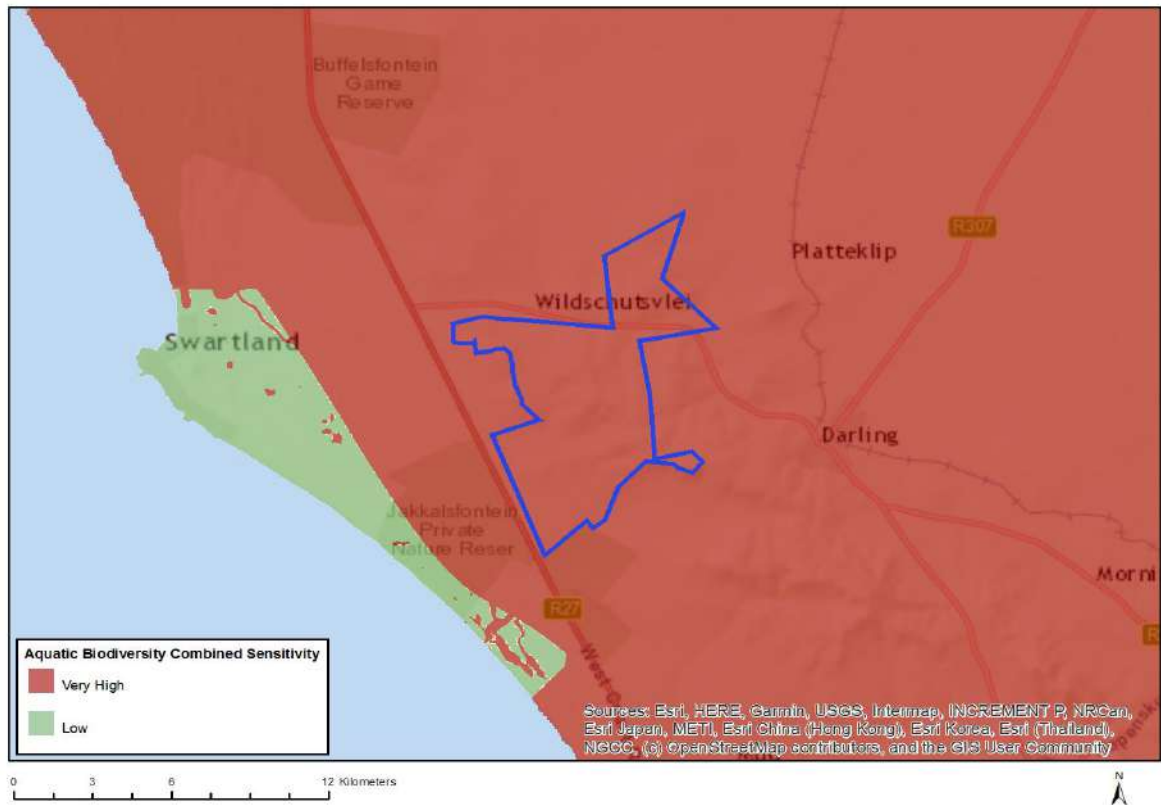

MAP OF RELATIVE AQUATIC BIODIVERSITY THEME SENSITIVITY

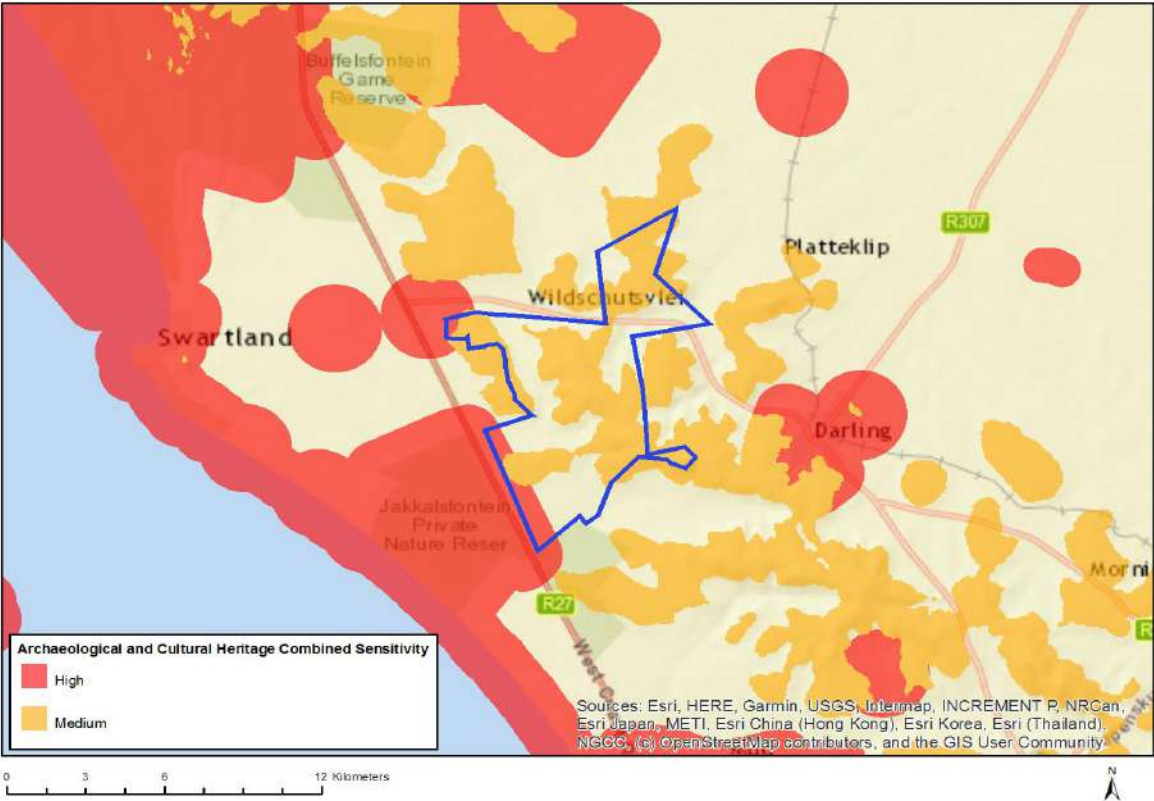

MAP OF RELATIVE AVIAN (WIND) THEME SENSITIVITY

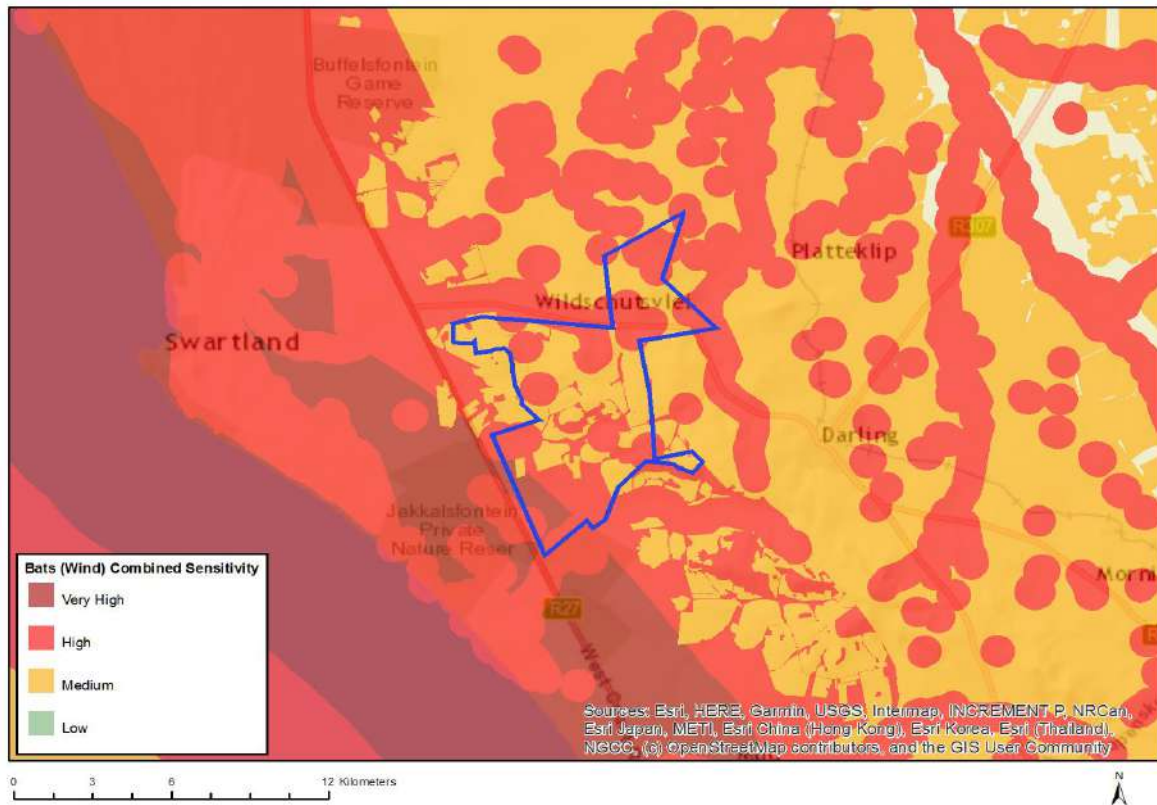

MAP OF RELATIVE BATS (WIND) THEME SENSITIVITY

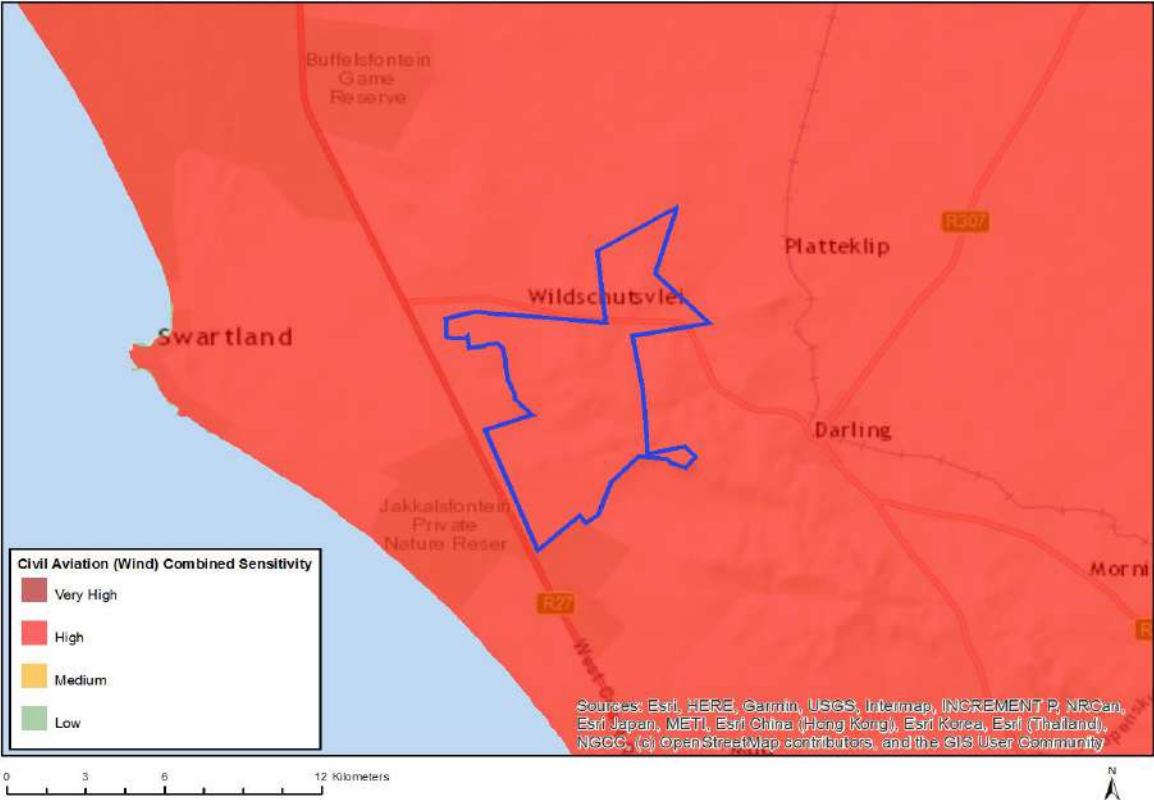

MAP OF RELATIVE CIVIL AVIATION (WIND) THEME SENSITIVITY

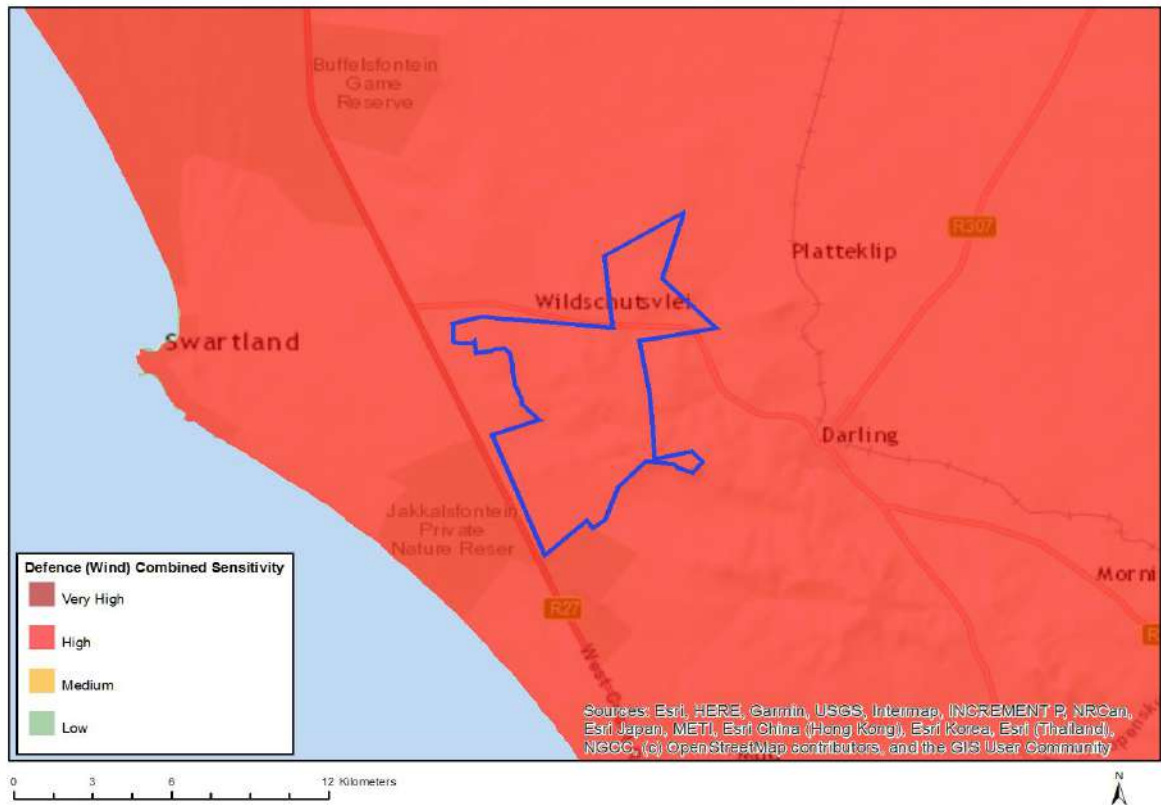

MAP OF RELATIVE DEFENCE (WIND) THEME SENSITIVITY

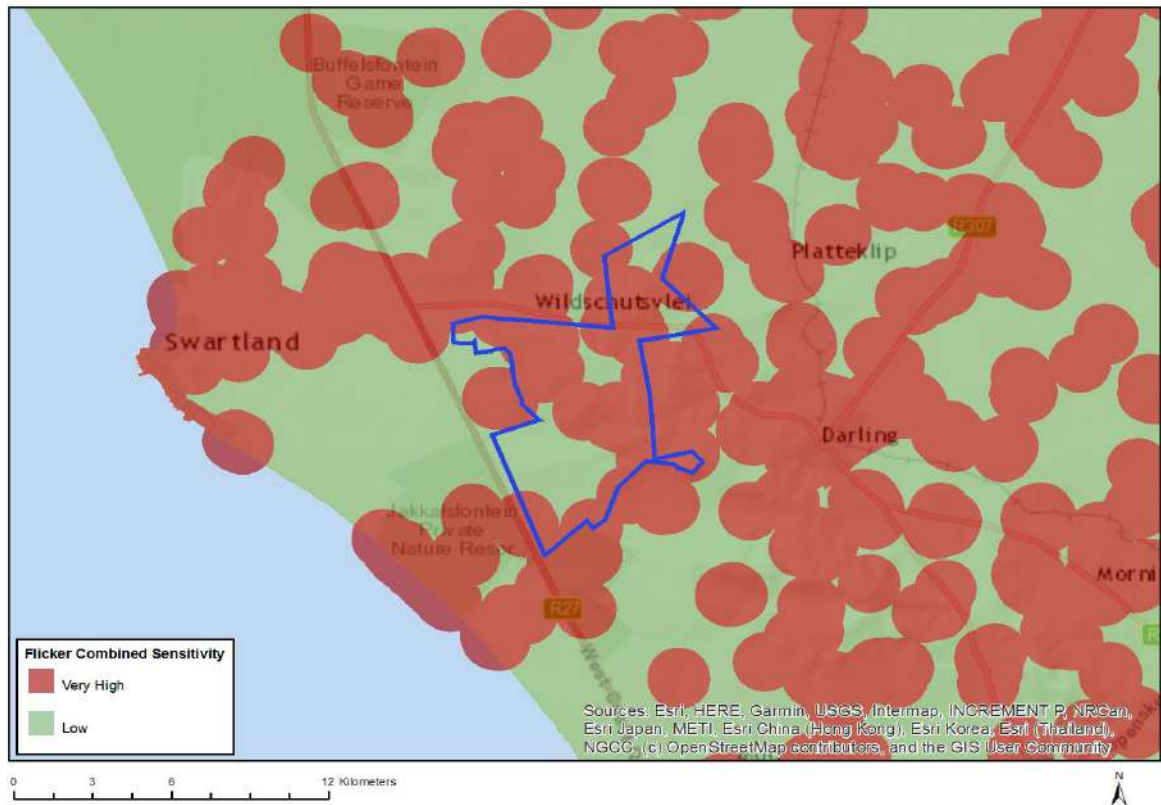

MAP OF RELATIVE FLICKER THEME SENSITIVITY

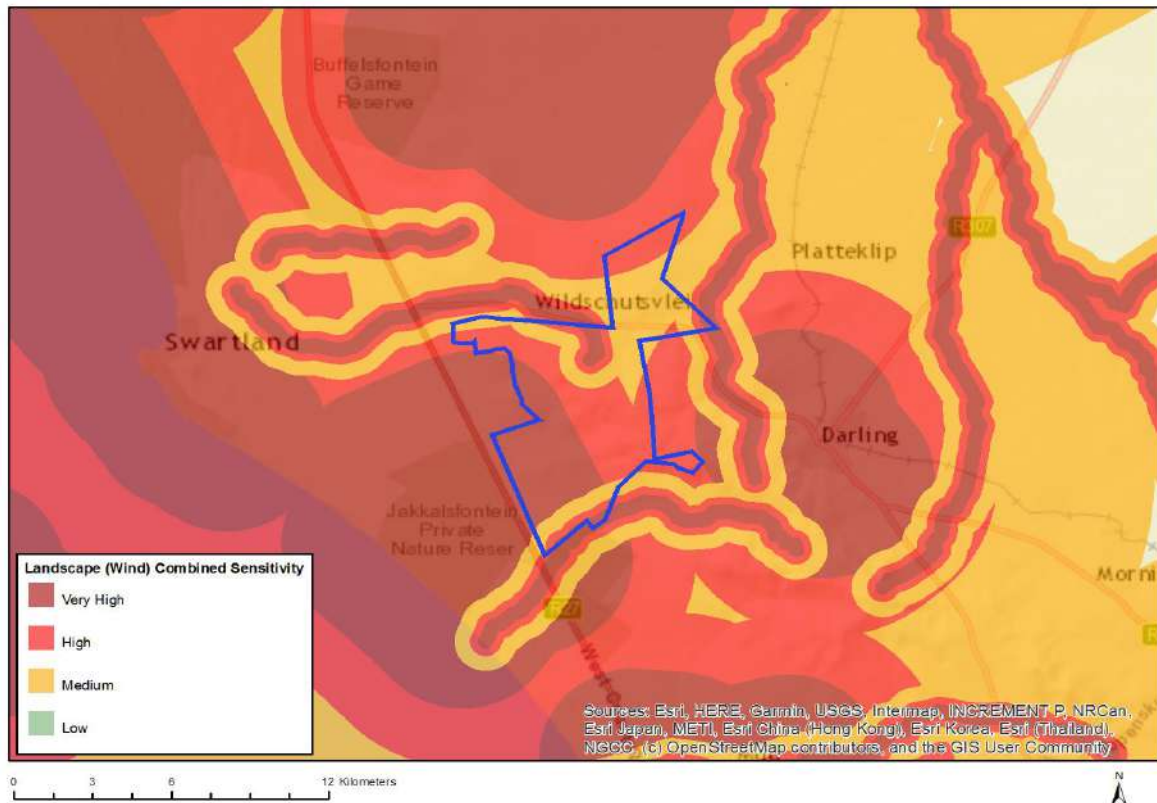

MAP OF RELATIVE LANDSCAPE (WIND) THEME SENSITIVITY

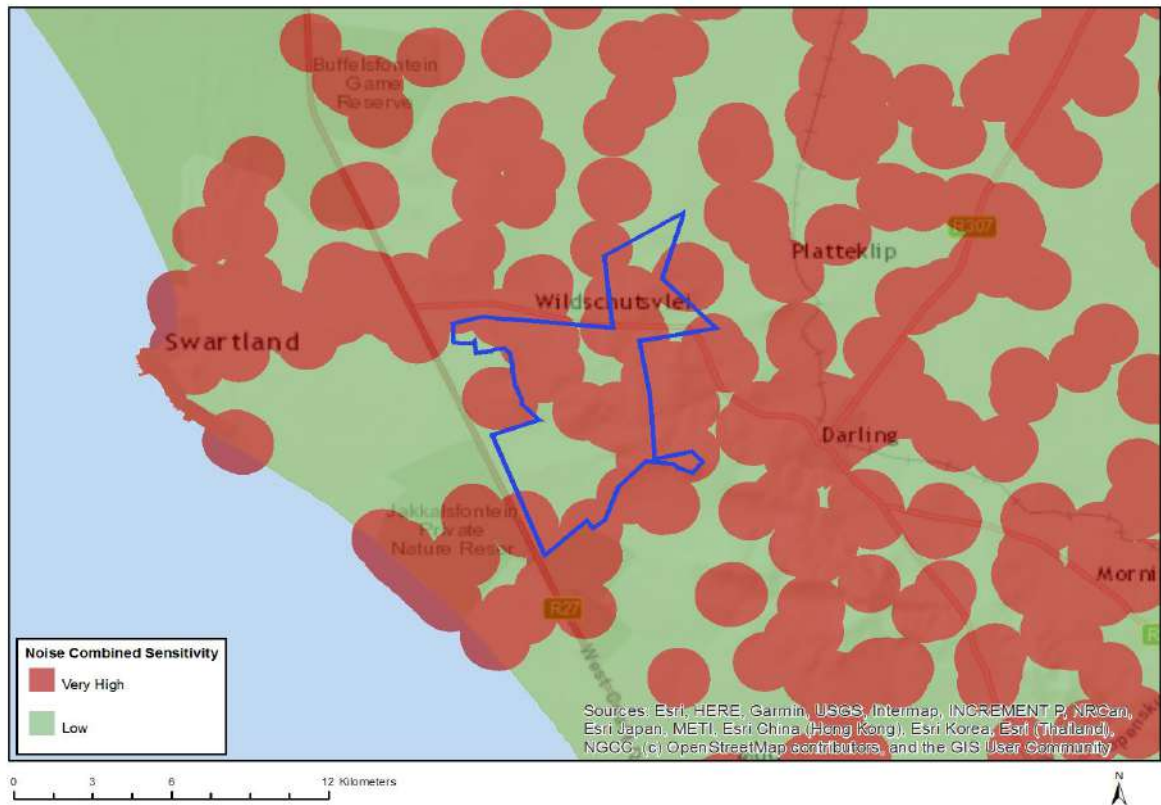

MAP OF RELATIVE NOISE THEME SENSITIVITY

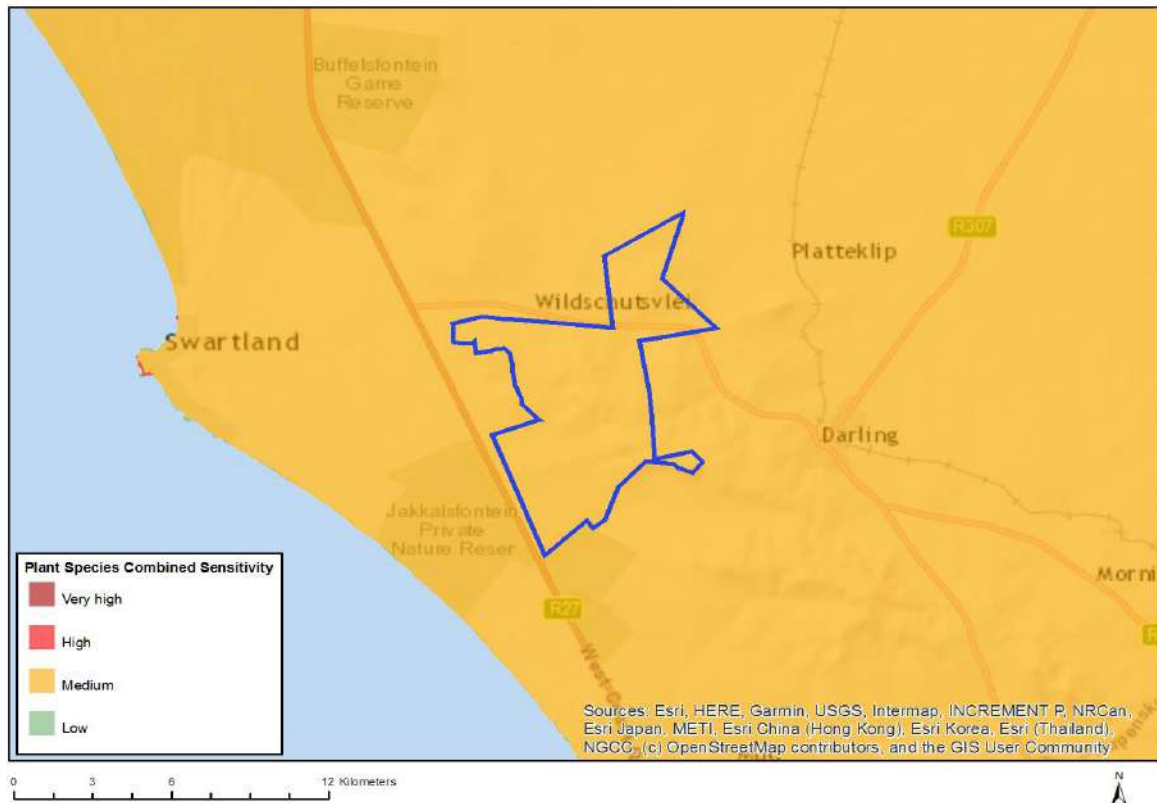

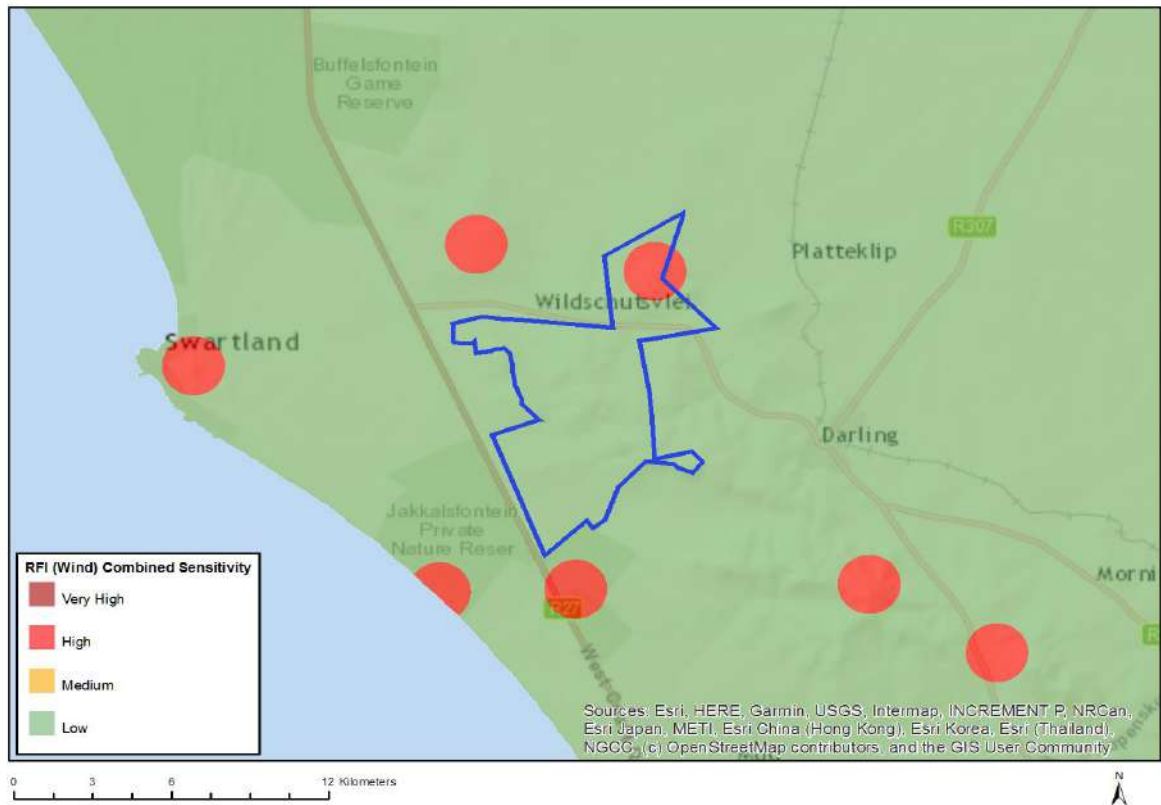

MAP OF RELATIVE RFI (WIND) THEME SENSITIVITY

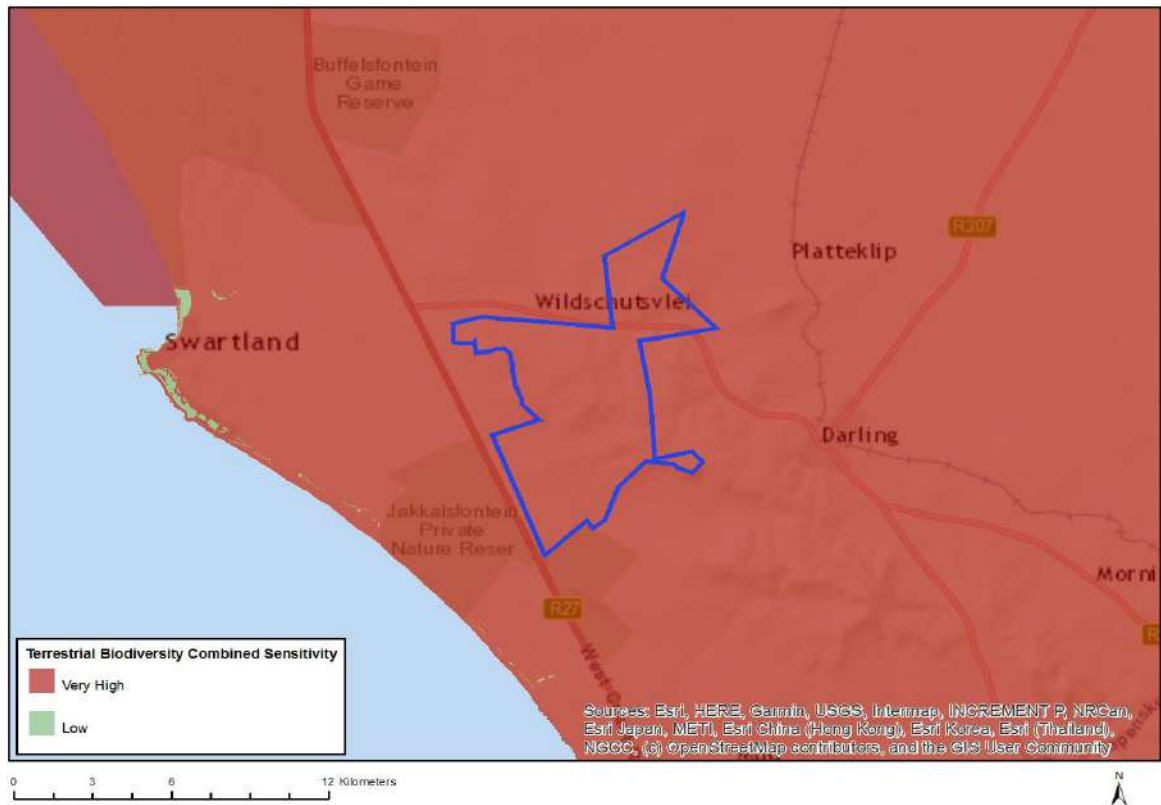

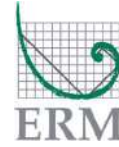

**Site Sensitivity Verification REPORT for the Part Two Environmental Authorisation Amendment for the Rhebokfontein Wind Energy Facility (WEF) in Western Cape, South Africa**

This Site Sensitivity Verification Report was compiled in terms of the *Protocols for the Assessment and Minimum Criteria for Reporting on identified Environmental Themes* (promulgated 20 March 2020 in GN No. 320). The report serves to verify the current use of the site in question and its environmental sensitivity as identified by the screening tool to determine the need for specialist inputs in relation to the themes included in the Protocols.

The location of the proposed development is shown in the aerial image included as Figure 1 and the surrounding context is depicted in Figure 2 & Figure 3. This site sensitivity verification relates to the Screening Tool Report (STR) for the above-mentioned proposed development that comprise the project and environmental application.

This report addresses the findings of the Screening Tool Report, attached, and provides a motivation for the various specialist studies identified to be conducted. It also discusses whether the specialist studies forming part of this project are required to comply with the above Protocol.

A Screening Tool Report was generated in May of 2020 as part of the EA application process. According to the Screening Tool Report, the following specialist assessments were identified and recommended to be undertaken as part of the environmental process:

1. Agricultural Impact Assessment;
2. Landscape / Visual Assessment;
3. Archaeological and Cultural Impact Assessment;

Since there are no sensitive receptors within this range, no specialist investigations were deemed necessary.</p>
Traffic Impact Assessment		<p>The area is mainly used for various agricultural activities. The roads (R27 and R315) are mainly used during the day. Traffic on the R27 and R315 dies down in the evening. Late at night/early morning there is no traffic on the R315. The movement of heavy vehicles will only occur during the construction phase and should movement of construction traffic on the site should be limited to the relevant access roads and construction site.</p>

The potential impacts on tourists and locals can be effectively mitigated by restricting construction traffic movements to weekdays, and, where possible, limiting activities during over holiday periods.

A Traffic Impact Assessment was screened out during the initial scoping phase. The proposed WEF therefore presents little traffic sensitivity and therefore, no specialist investigations were deemed necessary.
